

## Sand Lake Conservation Camp Participant Expectation Agreement

Please read, date, sign & return with registration form

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Camp is held to provide positive learning experiences for youth. To insure successful events, the health, welfare and participation of youth must receive utmost consideration. Because youth represent a large number of families from a wide variety of backgrounds and family customs, we want to be sure that we have common expectations. **Parent or guardian and youth are to read and discuss the following expectations:** 

- No drugs, tobacco, or intoxicating beverages permitted at any time at camp.
- No inappropriate/adult or obscene t-shirts (ex. alcohol, drugs, violence), string bikinis, or skimpy clothing.
- No aerosol or pump personal hygiene sprays (deodorant, body sprays, hairspray, etc.)
- Boys are not allowed in girls' cabins and vice-versa.
- Violation of safety rules endangering oneself or other persons will not be permitted.
- Youth will be responsible and sufficiently mature to conduct themselves at all times in an appropriate manner. Youth are expected to respect the rights of others to the hear speakers during programs, and are expected to act in a respectful manner towards everyone, including speakers, counselors, staff, and each other.
- Youth are expected to participate in scheduled activities while at camp and conduct themselves appropriately during mealtimes and free time periods.
- Youth will not leave Camp Bird for any reason (unless in an emergency and with consent of camp staff).
- · Youth will abide by Camp Bird policies and the behavior guidelines of Camp Bird and counselors/staff.
- Youth will follow swimming/boating rules as applied by the lifeguard on duty. Boaters must wear lifejackets.
- Wildlife, flowers, trees, and other plants are for all to enjoy as they are please do not disturb them.

#### **CONSEQUENCES**

Unacceptable behavior during Sand Lake Conservation Camp (as defined by this agreement, rules outlined on registration form, or by review of camp staff) will result in consequences to the participant. Consequences may include:

- 1. Early release from camp without a refund
- 2. Restitution or repayment of damages to camp property or the property of another at camp
- 3. Denial of future participation in Marinette County-sponsored camps/outings/events/programs
- 4. Forfeiture of financial support for a Marinette County camp/outing/event/program
- 5. Releasing the youth to the appropriate law enforcement agency and/or proper authorities

Note: Any conduct not specifically covered by this agreement or on the registration form, but deemed inappropriate by those responsible for Sand Lake Conservation Camp, will be viewed as a violation and appropriate action will be taken. If an infraction occurs, the person(s) in charge of the camp will provide appropriate communication to parents/guardians.

## **Choice Session Descriptions**

Presented by camp staff unless otherwise noted

**Archery** – Learn basic bow techniques, how to safely shoot a bow, improve your archery skills, and compete with other campers in mini-contests of skill. Modeled upon the National Archery in Schools Program, or *N.A.S.P.* 

**Bay Area Mounted Search & Rescue –** Meet area volunteers & their horses that help search for lost or missing people in rural or outlying areas, and what training is required to be a mounted rescue volunteer. Riders and their horses, as well as base camp volunteers, must go through many hours of training annually before they are approved for official duty. Training includes: 1st aid & CPR, radio communication, GPS, maps, horse obstacles, crowd control, parades, and more. (BAMSAR volunteers)

Canoeing – Learn basic canoeing skills and take a trip around Sand Lake. This activity is also available during free time.

**Challenge Course** – Test your problem-solving skills, balance/dexterity, mental toughness, and teamwork abilities by attempting physically & mentally challenging elements like the "lumberjack donut toss", "high wall", and "fisherman's bridge" as a group. **MUST wear close-toed shoes** - no flip-flops, sandals, slippers, crocs, etc. FOR 8<sup>TH</sup> GRADERS ONLY.

**Kayaking –** Learn the basics of kayaking technique & safety, and then explore Sand Lake! This activity is also available during free time. (*Marla Sutton, Vernon County*)

**Monarch Butterfly Migration** – The importance of milkweed, stages from egg to butterfly, migration to the north, planting for Monarchs, and tagging/fall migration will be discussed. We will learn to recognize milkweed plants and search for eggs and caterpillars. Also included will be a demonstration of tagging a butterfly for fall migration, and information on how you can help monarchs and other pollinators at home. (Charlene Breitlow, Volunteer)

**Nature Journaling** – Take a short hike to collect small natural objects, observe the natural world around Camp Bird, and construct your very own nature journal made from paper and sticks! Fill the pages of your journal with memories of camp and natural items we find on our hike through the woods.

Nature Photography — Come explore nature through a camera lens, venturing around Sand Lake and learning how to capture nature photography! This session will allow everyone to learn how to photograph the beauty of the world around you. Learning everything you need to know about nature photography, including how to use your camera, how to get proper exposure and framing so you can take amazing pictures of wildlife, flowers, landscapes and more. (Katie Albright, Volunteer) \* BRING YOUR OWN CAMERA — 35/110 mm, OR DIGITAL ONLY — no smartphone/I-phones/cellphones please. (If you want camp staff to store your camera for use only in this class, we can do that)

**Outdoor First Aid** – Learn some basic skills for handling first aid in the outdoors. Campers will practice several skills in various scenarios with different equipment and materials. Not an actual first aid certification course. Participants will receive information about organizations that offer certification programs like the Red Cross, NOLS, Wilderness Medical Associates, etc. (Marla Sutton, Vernon County)

**Spinner Making** – Lure making, knot tying, and other fishing lore. In-line spinners and plastic worms are popular lures for many fish species - learn to make spinners and how to rig a plastic worm. Learn fishing knots that will keep your new lures securely on your fishing line.

**Tee-shirt design** – Make a nature-themed tee-shirt to take home and show off to your friends! All creative materials provided (paint, pens, stamps, stencils, etc.) but bring your own tee-shirt to work with. **This is NOT making a tie-dye shirt.** 

**Wilderness Survival Skills** – Learn how to prepare for and react appropriately to survival situations in the outdoors. After a short instruction on how not to get lost, kids will learn important skills to keep themselves safe and comfortable until help arrives. This will be an outdoor class with lots of hands-on activities such as signaling for help, fire building, and constructing an outdoor shelter.

**Winged Wonders** – Have you ever met an owl face to face? What about a hawk? A falcon? Meet some of Wisconsin's common, but rarely encountered birds. Discover what a raptor is, hear their stories and learn what you can do to ensure they remain a significant part of the ecosystem. (*Raptor Education Group, Inc., Antigo, WI*)

**Wisconsin Wolves** – Learn about the life of wolves in Wisconsin, how biologists study them, and how humans have shaped the modern-day management of this iconic animal. You'll also get an up-close look at some of the equipment used to study wolves. (*Timber Wolf Information Network, Plover, WI*)
